
My Danish husband and I are blessed with two loving sons, both of whom also attend PVUSD schools where our youngest attends middle school and eldest will be a junior in high school.

MORNING MEETINGS (Social Emotional Learning)

Our class will begin each school day with our 4A Morning Meetings. When we are present as a community in the classroom, we are we are respectful of our Tribes community circle. This is a delightful part of of our day when we celebrate our classroom community.

Daily morning meetings provide that safe space because over time students learn to associate that morning time together as a place to come together and share about different things and different feelings. We begin with a greeting, classroom community activities, "check- ins", discussion slides, read alouds, goal setting, focus on character traits, range of emotions, etc... Ilike to follow up greeting each other with a check in. I have done this in a few different ways, but my favorites are using a 1-5 on our hands to show where we are at with our emotions that morning. A one being very sad, angry, upset, afraid feeling and a 5 being very happy, joyful, content, and excited. I love to give students the opportunity to share. If I see a student say they are a 1 or a 2 and that student is usually a 5, I take the time to check in with them.

DSPES will also be incorporating an SEL program known as Sanford Harmony again this school year. "Sanford Harmony is a social emotional learning program for Pre-K-6 grade students designed to foster intergender communication and understanding, connection, and community both in and outside the classroom and develop boys and girls into compassionate and caring adults.

Our morning meeting times usually range from 10-15 minutes. It all depends on the announcements, activity, read aloud, or discussion that we are working on or completing with the students. Also, in the early stages of starting morning meetings with your students, it may take time. Students might need time to get situated or used to the routine!

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

-Art, Music, and PE each have our own Google Classrooms - one per classroom teacher. Students have already been invited, so when they log in to Google Classroom they should see separate classes for Art, Music, and PE.

-For the first 3 days of school specialist teachers will follow the 1,2,3, rotation EACH DAY, this way they can touch base with all our students right away. :)

-Starting Monday Aug 16th specialists will begin WEEKLY specials rotations. So the class will have the same special for an entire week. It is felt that this would be easier for our students and their families.







- -Lunch is scheduled from 11:05 11:25.
- -Students have specific assigned seats in the Hawk's Nest.
- -Students are reminded to drink water/drinks to stay hydrated.

-Students are dismissed at 12:30 on early release days and 3:15 on our regularly scheduled days.






Organization, Independence, and **Study Skills**







- Each 4th grade student is responsible for using and maintaining an organized binder.
- Within each binder, students keep their material within the pocket/behind the tab for appropriate subject area.
- Papers are generally passed out to go home on Friday afternoons, and should be located in the "Home" section of the binder. Please ensure these are reviewed and removed regularly.
- Students are expected to keep their backpacks, binders and cubbies tidy/orderly.


- Homework planners: should be placed in the front of each student's binder
- Students write in their planners throughout the day.
- This is the main form of communication between school and home.
- *All assignments are to be written in the planner if a student has already completed the assignment, they may put a "checkmark" next to the assignment to indicate the assignment was completed at school..

Accountability:

- Each student will be provided with an accountability card.
- Each student will be introduced to the purpose and process of using the accountability cards.
- Accountability cards serve as a learning tool to promote growth in learning.
- Please note that when a student has a total of 5 incidents recorded for choices he/she has made, students are expected to bring their cards home to promote healthy discussion and growth.
- Accountability cards are always due back signed the following school day. Thank you
 for your support with this.

- We will teach the students many different tools to help them study.
- Examples: foldables, flashcards, highlighting, studyguides
- Most assessments, including math, have a vocabulary section., For example, students are expected to routinely study each of the Eureka module's vocabulary to promote retention, growth and confidence.
- Multiplication: Students are expected to have learned/mastered their multiplication facts 0-12. Please utilize the multiplication games packets provided for you this evening.



PLANNERS

Planners

Students are expected to fill out their planners throughout their day. Planners will be routinely checked for completion and accuracy. It is the student's responsibility to make sure they have neatly documented their homework/test or quizzes dates/projects/events within their planners. Each weekend students are asked to have their planner reviewed and signed by a parent/guardian. This signature will communicate to me that your child has communicated their weekly/long term assignments as well as their progress together with you. This is also an optimal time to ensure student binders are in organized condition. Organized planners and binders play an integral role in student success. Students are responsible for bringing their planners and binders to school daily as well as keeping them in respectable shape.







Homework Policy

In Grade 4 homework should take approximately 40 minutes in addition to 20-30 minutes of AR reading time. Many assignments are assigned within Google Classroom. *Please reach out to me if your child is struggling to complete his/her homework within this timeframe. Homework is checked for completeness and understanding. Homework is provided as practice of the skills we are currently learning in addition to nightly AR reading time. Please routinely check your child's planner for up to date assignments. We will go over completed assignments in class throughout the week to assist with questions. The homework grade is reflected in the Study Skills section of the report card. Students will be expected to submit their late work. A record of late work will be kept and communicated to parents/guardians. Please reach out if your child ever has questions or would benefit from additional support.

Missed Assignments

For each school day missed, students are given a day to make-up the assignments missed in class. For example, if a student misses two school days, they are given two days to make-up any assignments. Please feel free to ask for work if you know ahead of time your child will be out of school.







-Our PVUSD adopted math curriculum is **EUREKAMath** (Engage New York). Ongoing information on how to best support your child's success with this program will be routinely provided.

-Our lessons will typically follow a sequence. For example - fluency practice, concept development, application, Zearn, student debrief and exit tickets.

-ZEARN is our online educational math program that is in line with our learning within EUREKAMath. Students will be expected to complete a minimum of 4 Zearn lessons each week. Zearn will also be used to reinforce skills to bridge the gap during distance learning.





-McGraw Hill WONDERS is our adopted ELA curriculum which provides...

- A strong reading foundation
- Complex text
- Vocabulary development
- Range of comprehension skills and strategies
- A balance of high-quality, engaging literature and informational/expository text

-Students work in groups based on their skill set for a specific standard as others are individually working on, their personal reading goal or weekly reading strategy/skill.

-We also plan to enjoy various Literature Studies together.

-AR will be promoted daily to encourage students to pursue a range of genres each quarter as well as striving to meet their quarterly goals.







During reading lessons together, emphasis will be on...

Text features Literary elements Exploring a variety of genres Character traits Identifying text structures Making predictions Analyzing and comparing texts Informative texts Poetry **Reader's Theater** and much more!







-Step Up to Writing instructional strategies and writing lessons guide students in their understanding of each step in the writing process. Students will compose paragraphs as well as 5 paragraph essays while incorporating stages of the writing process.

-In Grade 4, students will be focused on writing:

- Opinions
- Informative/Explanatory essays
- Personal Narratives
- Creative writing
- Persuasive essays
- Reflections
- Research reports based on the inquiry process







-Grammar or Language Arts lessons will be supported through the use of a range of curricular materials, namely **Wonders**, and naturally incorporated into our learning whenever possible. We will focus on:

Parts of speech Sentence structure Capitalization Conventions And much more!

-Students will take grammar quizzes on a regular basis.

-Games, trade books, websites, videos, etc are also utilized to promote learning. -Students will continue with their **Daily Language Review** each week. Quizzes are scheduled on a bi-weekly basis.

-Students will also focus on our monthly set of Core Knowledge Sayings and Phrases.





-We will be utilizing the **Wonders spelling program**. Students are able to access weekly lists on **Vocabulary Spelling City** <u>here.</u>

-Typically, students would be provided with their spelling lists on Monday of each spelling week and tested on Fridays. Spelling will typically occur bi-weekly.

-Once our spelling routine is established, "Challenge Words" will also be provided that support a range of areas within our Grade 4 curriculum.





-Our adopted curriculum resources include **FOSS** Science resources, Mystery Science and exploring various informational OER's (open ended resources) and texts.

-Our focus areas are:

- Water, Climate and Human Impact on Our Environment
 - Earth and Space: Systems and Interactions
 - Physical Energy: Electricity and Magnetism
 - Soils, Rocks and Landforms/Geological Systems
 - Scientific Method and engineering practices
 - Scientific Community
 - STEM/STEAM





-Our focus in Grade 4 is on the recently updated state standards. We'll learn about Regions and Cultures of the Americas (Pre-Contact Americas to European Settlements - early inhabitants to 1763)

-Our Core Knowledge curriculum is cyclical in nature. In addition to our core standards we also have the opportunity to inquire into a variety of Core Knowledge units of study such as:

- Geography & Map Skills, Geology
 - Medieval Europe
 - Dynasties of China
 - Mayas, Incas and Aztecs
 - Medieval Islamic Empire
- Early & Medieval African Kingdoms

*Per school policy birthday invitations are to be distributed outside of school hours.




